

There has been an increase in seller impersonation scams. These scams follow a similar model and share common features - make sure you are aware of the warning signs! As a reminder, if any transaction raises red flags, please reach out. As scammers become more sophisticated, we all need to exercise increased caution.

PROPERTY

- Unimproved or vacant land The property being sold by fraudsters is usually unimproved or vacant land.
- No loans or liens The property being sold by fraudsters does not have any loans or liens.

SELLER(S)

- Foreign or absentee The owner of the property lives abroad or in another country/state.
- Contact information in an unrelated country The fraudster posing as owner has contact information from a different country/state.
- Unwilling to talk on the phone The seller is only dealing in email and text; unwilling to talk on the phone/no in-person contact.

TRANSACTION

- Documents executed in an unrelated location Deeds are executed and notarized in a different country/state than where the owner lives.
- Using bank(s) in unrelated location(s) The bank being used is located in a different country/state than where the owner lives.

REAL ESTATE AGENT INVOLVEMENT

- Real estate agents are not based in the area of the property.
- Real estate agents do not know the sellers.
- Contact and communication between the real estate agents and sellers is only via email and text.

ADDITIONAL RED FLAGS

- There are misspellings in documents.
- The transaction is urgent.
- The dates don't match up.
